

STATEMENT OF OUR STEWARDSHIP YTD Dec 31, 2025—Our Stewardship Report for the year ending December 31, 2025, reflects a net surplus of \$2,332 compared to the Budget of \$3,517. We are unfavorable to the Budget by <\$1185>, primarily due to higher property repair and utility costs. We would have had a net surplus of \$14,332, but we appropriated \$6,000 for 2026 Classroom remodeling and \$6,000 for higher 2026 Music costs against the 2025 budget.

CLASSICAL ASSESSMENT—For 2025, we must fund approximately \$17,068 to the Classis of Passaic Valley budget. Classical Assessment is \$100/each confirmed member of your family, so if you have a spouse and a confirmed child, the total amount owed is \$100 x 3 = \$300). You do not have to make the contribution in one payment even though there is only one colored envelope for the contribution. If you later contribute after using the colored envelope, just simply mark the envelope “Classical Assessment” so the counters know. If you have not made your contribution towards the Classical Assessment yet, please do so by using the classical assessment envelope and contribute \$100 per confirmed family member and write the total amount of the check on the envelope. This year’s Consecrating Stewardship theme “Growing in Giving” involves a generous heart through faith in God, recognizing that giving is an act of worship and obedience and that sowing generously leads to a bountiful harvest. By giving cheerfully, contributing to God’s work, and sharing one’s time, talent, and resources to help other’s needs, you are deepening your relationship with God. God will bless those who give, ensuing they have all they need to give generously. Growing in giving supports the spread of the Gospel and the advancement of God’s work on Earth. “In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven.” (Matthew 5:16)
