Oasis - A haven for Women and Children, Oasis is a nonprofit organization located in Paterson, NJ whose mission is to provide educational and social services to women entering the workforce and help fill the needs of children to flourish academically. They also operate a soup kitchen and provide food and clothing to residents in need.

We will be doing another drive to support the Oasis summer camp, which runs weekdays for 8 weeks and serves approximately 80 kids in addition to 15 counselors who are hired from Paterson through a first-time job program. Between now and **Wed, May 29**, we are collecting cases of water and individually wrapped, NUT-FREE snacks (e.g. chip assortment packs, granola bars, goldfish, veggie snacks, fruit snacks). In addition, Oasis could use outdoor toys including jump ropes, cones, hula hoops, bubbles, and other toys that can be used in a field. Donations may be left in the parlor. **We will also have a drop-off drive on May 29 from 5 pm to 7 pm outside the PRC Parlor door.**

PRC is doing a special collection for a Wayne family. On May 4, 2024, a tragic fire engulfed the home of the Jobst family, causing significant damage to their house and all of their possessions, and dealing a severe emotional and financial blow to Andrea and her three children. While they are thankfully safe, they are mourning the loss of their cherished dog, Cali, who sadly perished in the fire. Cali was not just a pet but a beloved member of their family, having grown up alongside Andrea's children. The bond between Cali and the family was deep, and they are devastated by this profound loss. Coping with the absence of Cali adds an extra layer of grief as they navigate rebuilding their lives from scratch after losing their home and belongings.

Known for their kindness and selflessness, Andrea and her family have always extended a helping hand to those in need. Many in our community know Andrea for how thoughtful she is, often going above and beyond for others. Please help us raise donations to assist the Jobst family with temporary housing, clothing, and essential items. We will have a collection basket in the sanctuary window by the hallway. Every contribution, no matter how small, will make a difference. From the collection, we will put together a small basket with a check from PRC made out to the family. We will be taking donations until Sunday, May 19th.



First, he is our advocate in heaven in the presence of his Father.


Second, we have our own flesh in heaven as a sure pledge that Christ our head will also take us, his members, up to himself.
